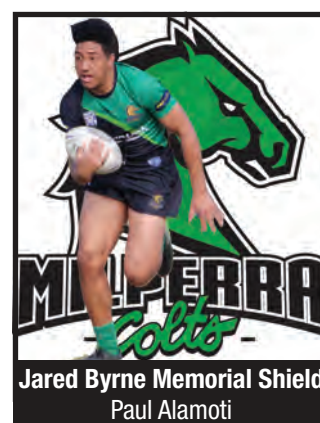

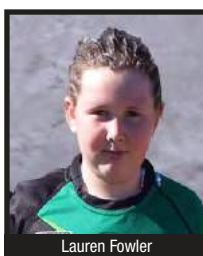

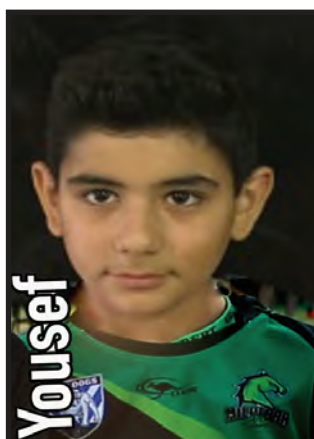

Flashback 10 YEARS AGO IN 2008

In 2008, Fred Hagan was president of the Milperra Colts for the 15th straight season. The Colts fielded 9 teams in 2008 (Under 6s -13s). For the first time in eight seasons, the Colts were able to field two Under 6 teams in 2008.

Flashback 20 YEARS AGO IN 1998

In 1998, the Colts fielded 10 teams this season and five teams made the semi-finals (7s, 9s, 11s, 13s, 14s). The Under 7s finished the season in fourth position after winning 8 of their last ten games. Unfortunately lost the minor semi-final to St Christophers 9-26.

The Under 9s finished fifth and lost their Preliminary final to St Lukes 15-25. The Grant Davis coached Colts Under 11s finished in fifth spot which meant that they qualified for a playoff against St George Dragons. They won this playoff 45-17 and won the Preliminary final against St Johns (32-14) and the minor semi-final against East Hills (25-0). The Milperra Colts finished first in the Under 11s Relay, second in the Under 6s relay and third in the Under 9s and Under 12s relays.
