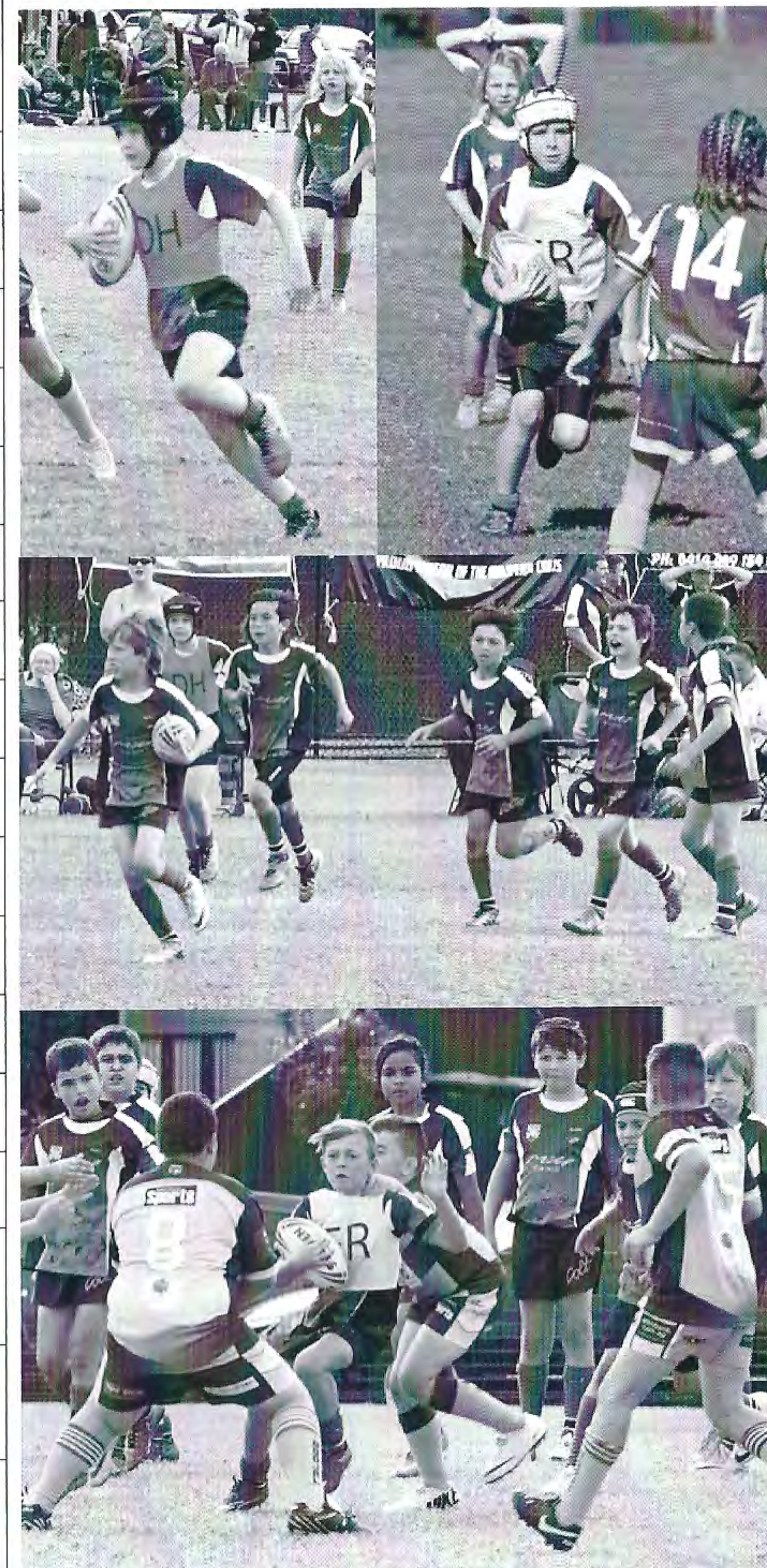
### Jarryd Walshe

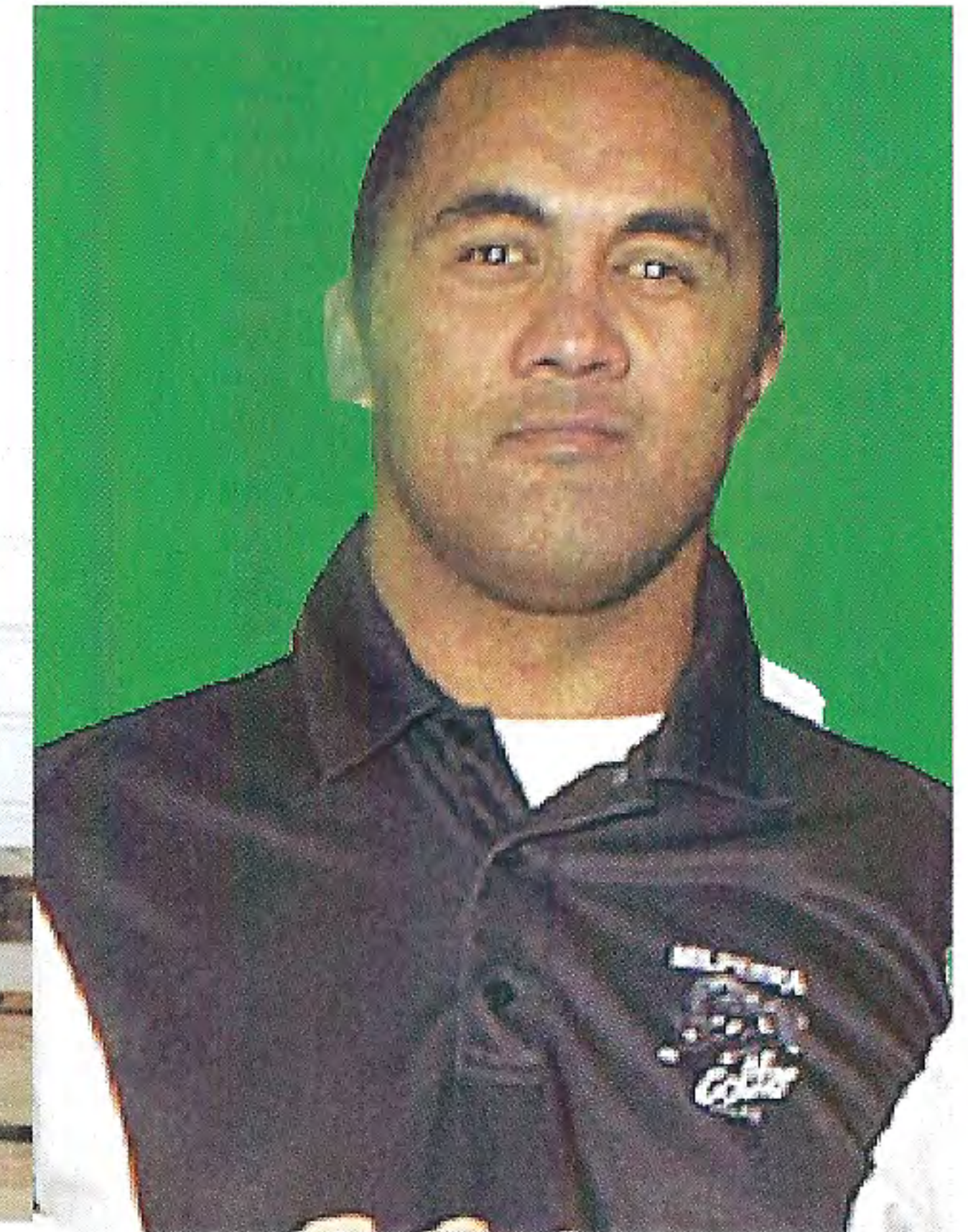
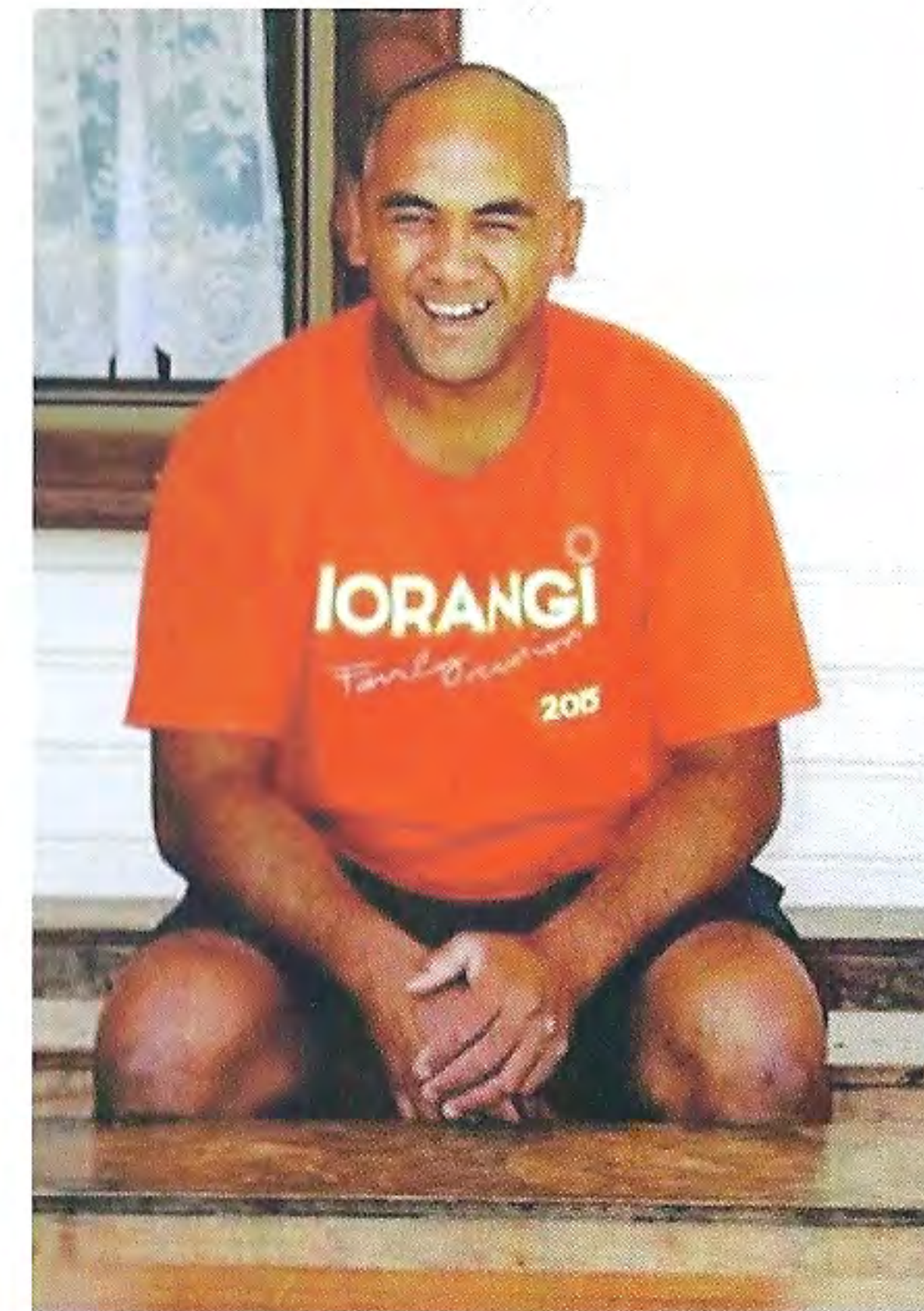
## Ben Pera

Ben's coaching talents were recognized when he was awarded the Milperra Colts Coach of the Year in 2013.

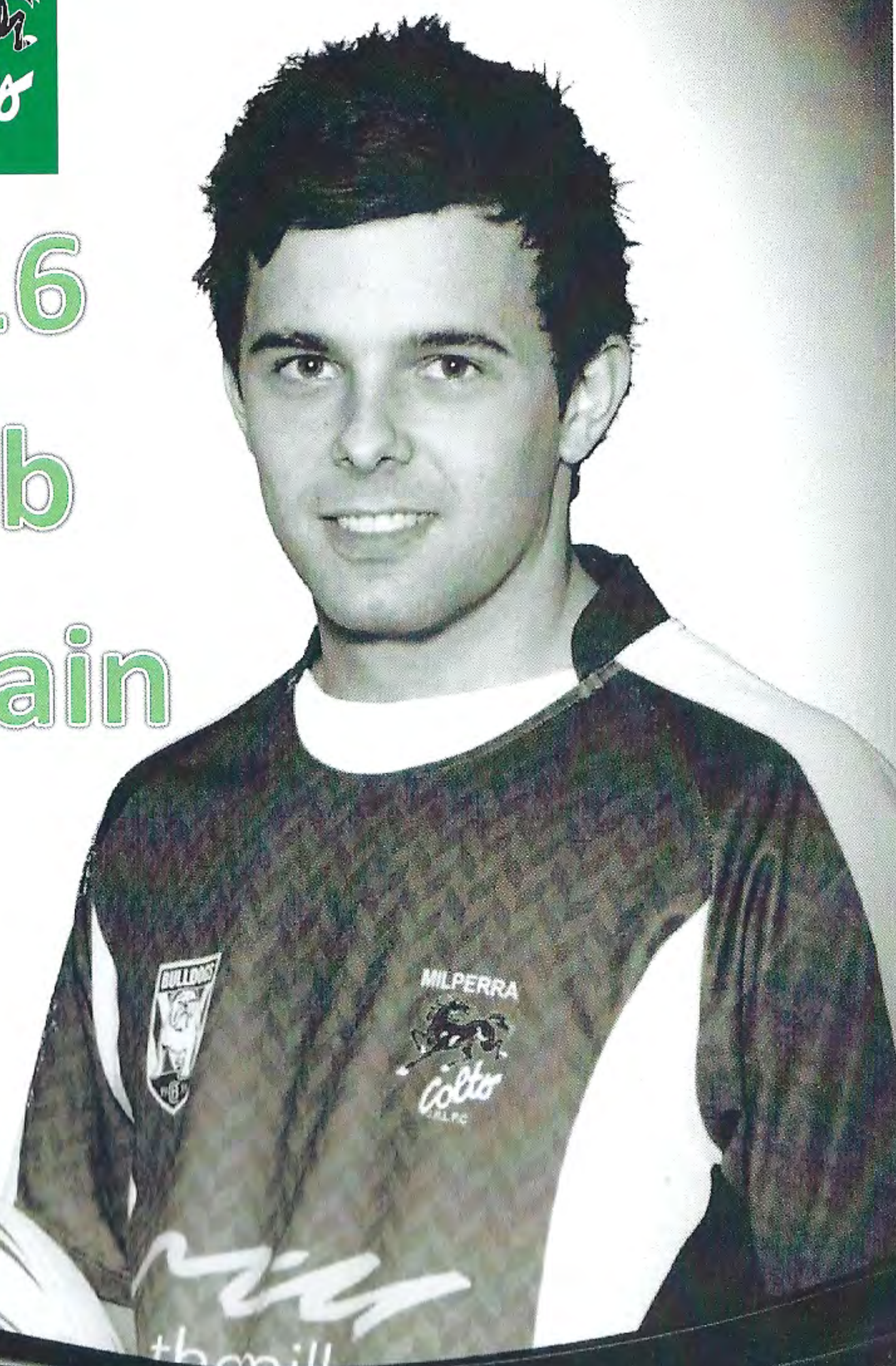
Ben was a much-loved volunteer who forged positive relationships with everyone within the club. He was a gentle giant who will be much missed by the Milperra Colts community.





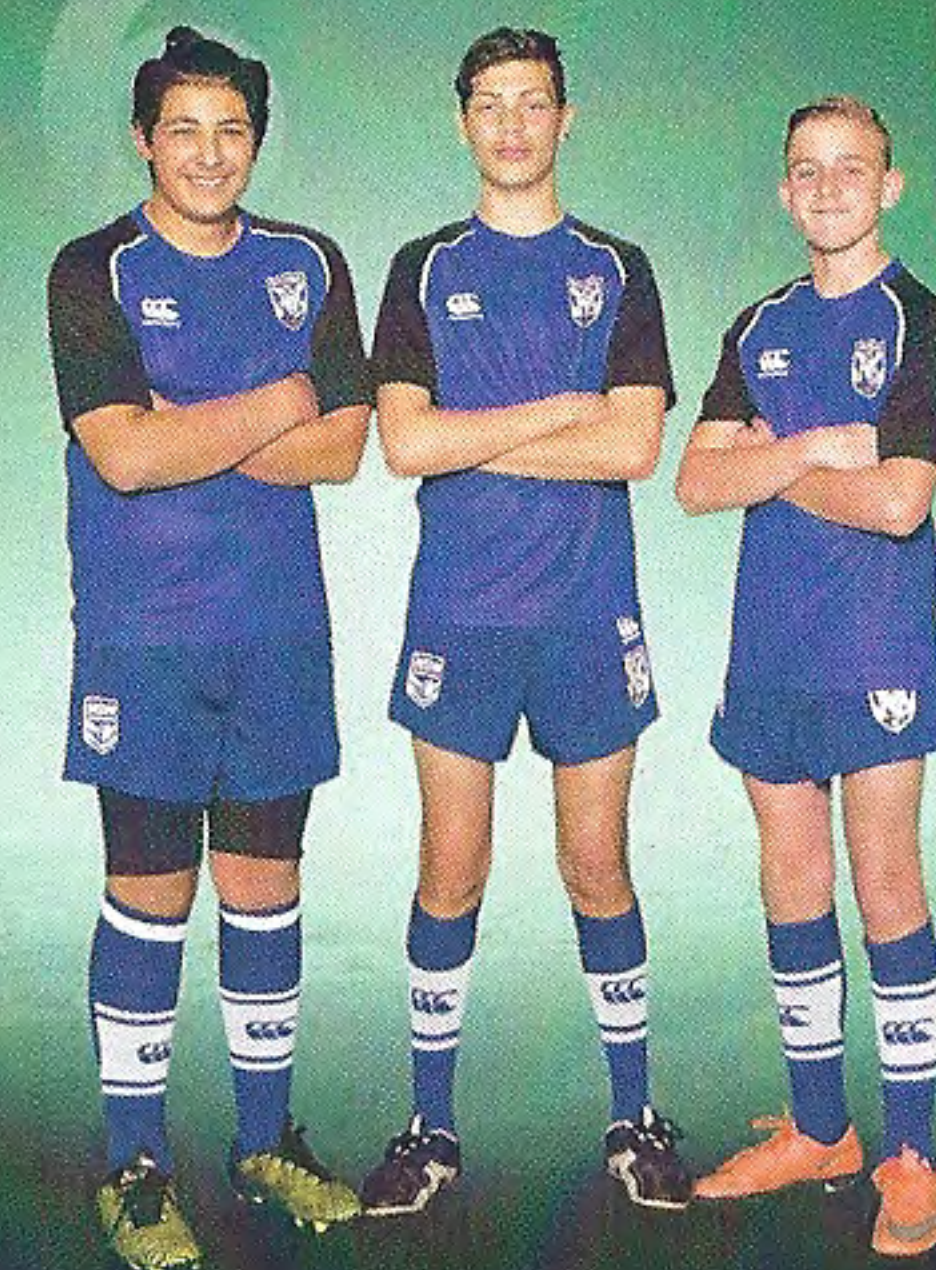
